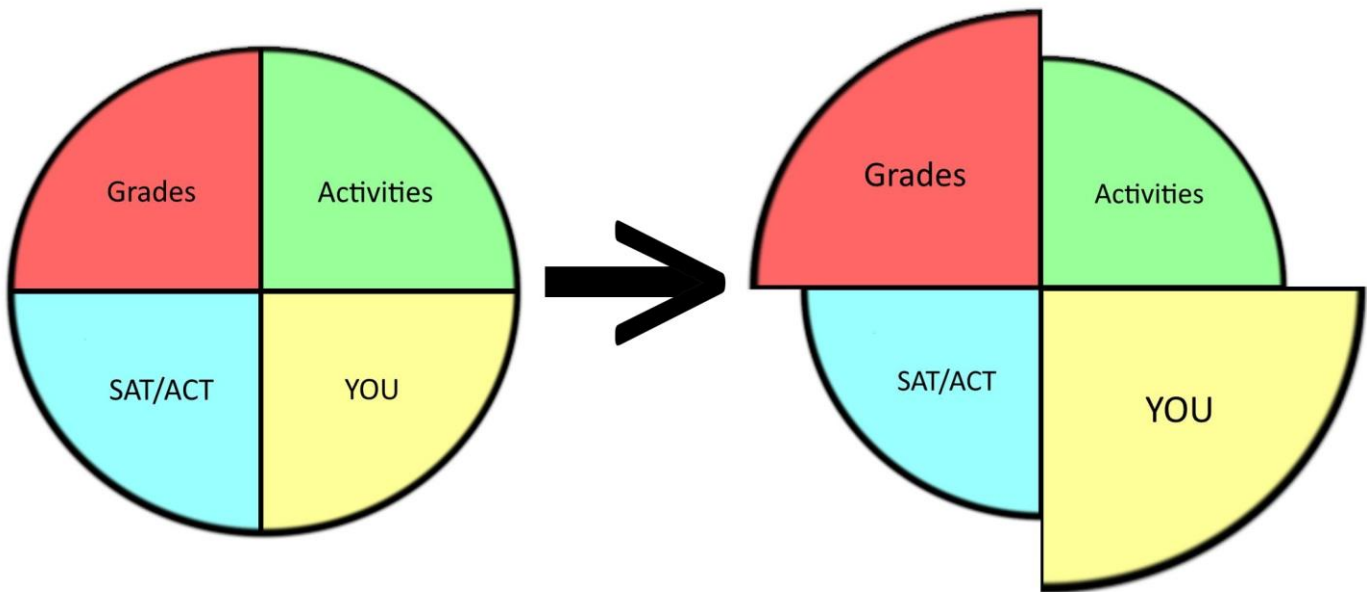

These days... harder admission at large and selective schools
(Though easier admission at smaller and less selective schools)

So what can I do to stand out and improve my chances?

1) Grades

- Rigorous coursework (esp. in your potential areas of study)
- Less common class choices (College courses, 2 science classes at once, etc)

2) Activities

- Quality over quantity (Starting a club > being in 3 clubs)
- Think outside the classroom (anything NOT directly through your school?)
- Initiative, leadership, etc.

3) SAT/ACTs

- More than 50% of schools remain Test Optional/Test Blind. Less than 50% of students submitted scores last year.
- Students with test scores got accepted more often. Esp. STEM and Business - the math score confirmatory evidence mattered here.
- Some confounding variables here (1500s submitted, 1100s not submitted)...
- ... but it's at least worth figuring out if you should take and/or submit SAT/ACT scores

Why take the test(s)?

- "Test Optional" → **More competitive**, because more students apply. Without scores, more emphasis on other things.
- Can help **imperfect grades**
- Virtually all schools **Superscore** SAT, and some do the same for the ACT. Most schools just consider the highest scores you submit, though some look at all of them.
- You can **cancel** your ACT scores after you get them; SAT can only be cancelled for like 5 days after your test (so before your scores come out)
- Can't hurt! "Differential Score Reporting" = **Can send score to SOME schools**, not others
- Basically, take **Practice Tests** to see where you might be at, and take/send if **you're at or above the median.**

Which test should I take?

<u>ACT</u> (the "Fast but Simple" Test)	<u>SAT</u> (the "Slow but Tricky" Test)
215 questions in 3 hours (+ optional essay)	154 questions in 3 hours 5 minutes (no optional essay after June '21)
1/4th Math	1/2th Math

Many students try both tests - colleges will use your higher score!

When to test? Recommended SCHEDULE (in non-Biblical-plague years)

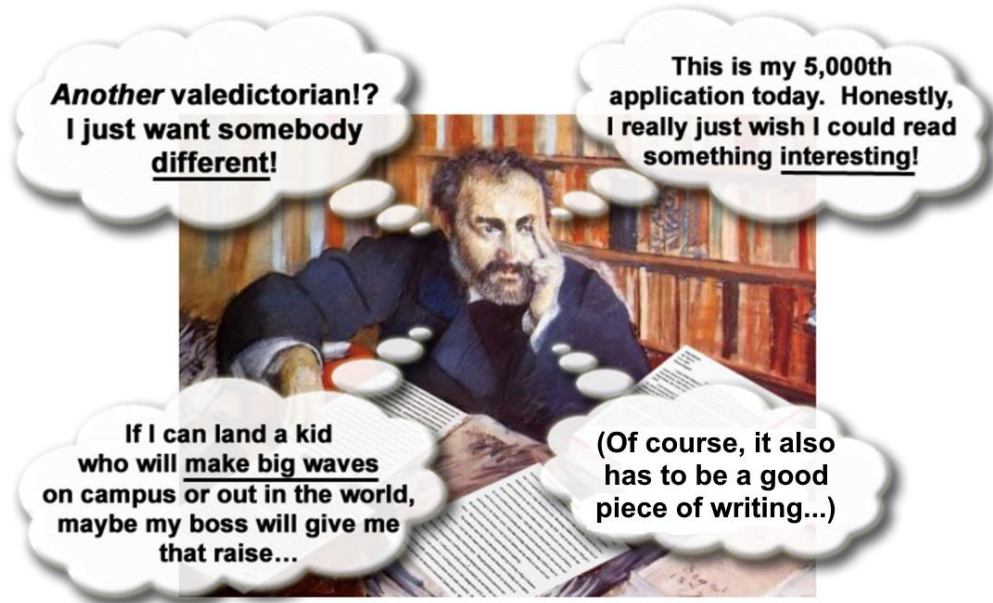

4) Essays



Approach #1 – Be Impressive (aka something most people haven't done)

Approach #2 – Be Different (what makes you different from your friends?)

Approach #3 – Be Interesting (what essay haven't they seen before?)

Now, 6 things NOT to write about...

- Stuff that's **already been said** elsewhere on your application.
- Way off-topic stuff. Don't just answer the **prompt**, but don't ignore it either.
- Somebody **else** (unless that's the prompt, but regardless it should really be about you).
- "**Smoke words**" ("My commitment and passion for goals") and other **generic stuff anybody could say** ("My work ethic"). Readers HATE vague or obvious stuff and LOVE description and uniqueness ("Steve Madden boots in cow pies").
- Overly **cliché topics** (my sport, my mental illness/tragedy, my trip, my bland activity...)
- A gimmick that **isn't you**. Give what they want, but not at the expense of who you are.
- #7 Covid? Depends...

Make your list, then a plan. UCs → Common App → Supps/Scholarships. And get help!

Application Essay Brainstorm Sheet

- What will be the most notable thing you do in college?
- What will be the most notable thing you do in your career?
- What are you really good at?
 - o How did you get good at it?
 - o What was the moment you realized you were good?
 - o When did you get a chance to show it?
 - o How could this ability help you in college or life?
- Do you have any interesting stories?
 - o Funny?
 - o Amazing?
 - o Touching?
- What's something really random about you?
- What are you really BAD at?
- What's the biggest challenge you've had to overcome?
 - o Did you overcome it? (It's OK if you didn't)
 - o Either way, what did you learn?
- What is your biggest regret?
- Have you ever found yourself thrown into a new situation?
- Have you ever not fitting in somewhere?
- Have you ever taken any interesting trips? Any good stories? What did you learn about the world/other people/yourself?
- What has been your most meaningful extra-curricular activity, even (especially?) if it's not the most resume-worthy?
- What adults in your life/in society do you most admire?
 - o Why?

5) What Else Can I Do?

Early Action/Early Decision. Pandemic saw Early Decision acceptance % outpace Regular Decision acceptance % even more than usual... though it depends on the school. Don't know of anywhere Regular Decision was BETTER though.

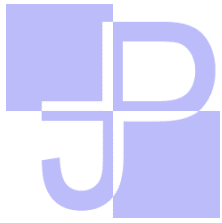
Demonstrated Interest
